Who are the leaders in Georgia history and what characteristics do
they possess?
Place students in groups of four. Ask them to think about how they would prepare a book to teach younger students about Georgia's leaders. After they have considered possibilities, tell them that their task for the day is to actually create a book that they will present to younger students.
Tell students that their book will be 24 pages long. (Note: letters "Q" and "Z" will be omitted.) Each member of each group will be responsible for six pages. Here are the criteria for the booklets: Each page must have the letter in both capital and lower case, a picture of the Georgia leader, (students may either draw or trace a picture of the leader or download a picture from the Internet), and three sentences. The first sentence must identify the leader. The second sentence will state what he/she did to make him/her a major leader in Georgia. The third sentence will identify the characteristic which assisted him/her in becoming a leader. Once each person has completed his/her six pages, the group will collate its pages, and place them in a folder.
Groups will share their ABC Books with the other groups. Groups may then donate their ABC books to a primary class.
